approval or disapproval of these nominations shall be given by ballot. If the nomination be rejected, then the session shall nominate again until there be a choice.

4th The Superintendent shall preside over and have the school under his immediate control, he shall arrange the classes and the appointments of the teachers; to aid him in which he may call in (if deemed necessary) the assistance of the session. It shall be his duty from time to time to suggest such measures for the benefit of the school as he may think important, which suggestions shall be duly considered by the session. He shall make or cause to be made under his supervision an annual report of the condition of the school. In his absence the vice Supt. shall perform all his duties.

5. The Female Assistant shall cooperate with the Superintendent in the management of the Female Class, shall act in harmony with his views, and in all matters of importance only with his advice and approbation.

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6th The Secretary, Treasurer, and Librarian shall perform the duties usually considered as belonging to those offices, and such as have hitherto been discharged by them in the Sabbath school.

7th Annually in March a report of the conduct and prospects of the Sab. School shall be given at a public meeting, at which time the Superintendent and Assistant shall be nominated, and the other officers appointed, as above directed.
